

A Knight's Saint's Corner. Saint Brother Andre Bessette [1845-1937]. Born in what was known as Lower Canada to a French Canadian family with seven children, his father dies when he is ten and by 1857 he is an orphan. For

six years he lives with his aunt Marie-Rosalie and her husband Timothee, without much education, poor and sickly. It was his mother who instilled in him by example the love and tenderness to others which identified him later on as the porter 'Brother Andre'. In his search out of poverty which afflicted so many French Canadians at the time he went, as did many others, to the States. By 1867 he moves back to Canada. He meets Father Provencal, a friend from his younger years. Three years later he arrives at Notre-Dame College in Montreal and there his life's story begins as the Apostle of Saint Joseph and Friend of the Suffering. There he joined the Congregation of the Holy Cross with the recommendation from the priest, saying "I am sending you a saint..." Many years later, Brother Andre recalled that he was shown the door and stayed there as doorkeeper. Humility, Prayer, the Gospels and an unwavering devotion to Saint Joseph took him beyond just being Brother Andre the porter. Because of his commitment and gift to listen, to listen to multitudes of people coming to him for solace and kind words much more grace and energy followed. Without it there would be no Saint Joseph's Oratory on Mount Royal in Montreal. All started with his prayers to and with Saint Joseph to build a chapel near the College in 1902.

Brother Andre died on January 6th 1937, by that time construction of "St. Joseph's Church" is at a standstill. The funeral draws people from all directions and segments of society and Church, thirty years later the Oratory is finally finished and in 1982 this humble man is declared Blessed. In October 2010 under Pope Benedict XVI Brother Andre is canonized a Saint.

I look forward to our time together of spiritual reflection in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Throughout

my priesthood and especially in the past several years, these moments of prayer and reflection together have been deeply rewarding for me.

I propose to reflect with you on the Beatitudes of St. Matthew's Gospel Chapter 5 as well as a series of Psalms of the Old Testament which we pray each day at Mass. As usual, we will also give time to the liturgical celebrations of Lent/Easter as we pass through the year.

It is good to remember that there is no starting point or end point as in a series of lectures or an academic course. Though we refer to previous reflections, we repeat our thoughts frequently so that anyone can join at any stage or miss weeks without losing any necessary points or developments. I like to think of our reflections as one long continuous series of reflections on a mystery from countless starting points. All these reflections I pray will be beneficial for us at whatever time of life or stage of our spiritual pilgrimage. The Lord, in whose presence we will pray together will always provide the grace, consolation, and strength that we need to make steady progress in our life of faith.

Thanks to the generosity of our funders, we are pleased to offer this certificate program at a nominal fee of \$500 for confirmed participants.




