A Knight's Saint's Corner. Saint Charles Joseph Eugene de Mazenod. Born in France in 1782, the founder of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, Bishop of Marseilles and with great commitments a minister to people on the fringes of society and to bring the Gospels and Jesus to them. Born into minor nobility but driven to flee the French Revolution with his parents to Italy, he was able to study in Turin but because of their financial difficulties had to move again, this time to Venice. There under the care of a priest, Don Bartolo Zinelli, he received his basic education and a sense of the presence of God and a touch of piety.

Unfortunately the family moved again to Naples and Eugene experienced the loneliness and detachment of his life, but things did turn around thanks to a Duke Cannizzaro in another move to Palermo. Life became tolerable again and he was able to pick up on the life left behind in France and started to call himself Count de Mazenod. At the age of twenty he returned to his homeland but had to adjust to a life as a "normal" citizen, with his parents divorce and his mother's desperate search to find a well to do bride for him. Thanks to his time in Venice and Father Zinelli the Holy Spirit started to work with him, his concerns for others and the sorry state of the Church after the Revolution took shape. Despite his mother's wishes he decided to become a priest and on December 21th 1811 was ordained in Amiens.

With likeminded priests he ministered to the young, the poor and brought the Good News to people who never heard of Jesus and his message, out of this movement came the Oblates of Mary Immaculate with the blessings of Pope Leo XII in 1826. Twenty years later members of his Oblates where ministering to the Native population in what is known now as Canada. They came on an urgent plea of Bishop Ignace Bourget of Montreal and spread out to the west and north. For 35 years Eugene guided the Order and till today it is still alive and active in Canada and around the world; as Bishop he continued his work in the dioceses with the same vision and zeal till the end of his life. Five years before his death in 1861 he was named senior bishop of France and in his final statement to his Order he said:"....among you - charity and more charity and in the world - zeal for souls!"
