A Knight's Saint's Corner. The Missionaries who came to the Huron/Wendat territories in the 17th century did not only bring the Gospel to the people there but also some sickness which the Native population had no natural defence against. Despite all the hardships and

opposition but with the help of individuals like *Joseph Chiwatenhwa* the Word spread and bore fruit. Joseph encountered Jesus and Christianity in 1636, he got sick, recovered and was baptized by *Fr. Brebeuf* on Aug. 16th 1637. A year later on March 19th his wife *Marie Aonetta* was baptized and on the same day their marriage was blessed; one can say the first Christian wedding in what is now Ontario. More converts followed including Joseph's brother and other family members became witness's too for the growth of the Church not only within the Aboriginal communities but also for the new arrivals on the continent.

Within a short time, Joseph found a strong and deep faith, a prayer life which was admired by the Jesuits and the new Christians alike. He helped with the learning of his language, translations and a way to put it down on paper. Pope John Paul II in his homily in Midland in 1984 said about Joseph and his family: "These new Christians knew by instinct that the Gospel, far from destroying their values and customs, had the power to purify and uplift the cultural heritage..." Joseph died a martyr in 1640 for the sake of the Gospel, he was one of many Christians who lost their lives in that political struggle between the French and English and their Native allies. Under the fairly new category "Oblatio Vitae" [the free offering of one's life] in the Church, Joseph Chiwatenhwa is certainly a good candidate for Blessed and eventual Sainthood status. Let us pray.

<u>Property Survey</u> <u>Update to Parish</u> 23 Feb 2025

To recap, when the Parish approved Concept 2 to

demolish the Rectory and potentially sever off 2 lots along Railton Road, it was believed that the church property was a rectangle 100m X 200m approximately: in essence, from the brick bungalow North to Railton Road, and West from Sydenham Road to the vicinity of the 3^{rd} hydro pole.

However, a survey by Hopkins Chitty Land Surveyors has confirmed that the property extends 400m down Railton Road, slightly beyond the end of the farm field. The footprint resembles a hockey stick in shape, rather than a rectangle. This means that the two severances will extend further down Railton Road beyond the fence line at the edge of the rear gravel parking lot.

This is much more advantageous to us, as there would be no requirement to relocate the septic tank, envisaged previously for severing one of the lots. In addition, the archeological assessment is simplified.

Well drilling will occur in early May respecting township road load restrictions.

The survey will be uploaded to the church website this coming week.
