Message from Fr. Michel Quenneville

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Thanksgiving is a wonderful holiday! It offers us an opportunity to take stock of the Lord's blessings in our life: family, friendship, health, security, etc.

As Christians, as disciples of the Lord in His Holy Catholic Church, we know that this is not and should not remain a once-a-year thing activity! In fact from the very beginnings of the Church, Christians would gather around the Apostles once a week - on a Sunday - to pray, to hear their Apostolic teaching and to break bread (Acts 2:42). They were commemorating the Lord's Supper in celebrating the Holy Eucharist. The word 'Eucharist', derives from the Greek (*eucharistein*) meaning 'to give thanks'. When we gather for Mass, we offer up the Holy Eucharist, we *give thanks* to the heavenly Father! Every week at Mass, we recall that we are a 'thanksgiving' people: giving thanks to God for all of the week's blessings and looking ahead to the week to come.

As Christians - especially as Catholics who have the gift of the Holy Mass! - gratitude is already builtin! It's already part of our weekly habit. Thanks be to God! Simply, let us not forget it.
